

Be Baptized

Pray



Your relationship with God is similar to relationships you have with other people. They take time together, talking and listening to each other. That's what prayer is. It's talking with God about the things on your heart, and listening for what's on His. How do you do that? It's easy, just remember the word "PRAY".

P—Praise God for who He is. Tell Him how much you appreciate Him for who He is and for what He has done for you? Need some help? Check out Psalm 100.

R—Repent of your sin. As you get to know God better, you will find yourself sinning less. Still, there will be times when you stumble. When you do, simply confess your sin and ask God to forgive you.

A—Ask for what you need. God is interested in the things that interest you. Tell him what's on your heart. Ask Him to help you know Him better. Ask Him to meet your needs. He wants you to ask, so don't be shy, go ahead and ask.

Y—Yield to God's plan. Having Jesus as your Lord means living His way. That means giving up your plans so that you can follow His better ones.

Read the Bible



The Bible is a great book. It tells us about God and how to live in relationship with Him. It tells us about people and how to live in relationship with them. It tells us about how God has acted in the past. It tells us about what's going to happen in the future. But where do you begin?

We suggest beginning by reading through the Gospel According to John. Why there? Because it's a book that was written specifically so that "you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name" (John 20:31).

John is the fourth book in the New Testament. You can find it by checking the table of contents at the front of your Bible.

Start reading a paragraph or two every day. Soon you'll find yourself reading a chapter or two. And before you know it, you'll be through John and ready to move on to other books.

Don't have a Bible? Don't know which version to read? We suggest the New International Version, and we'd be happy to provide one for you. All you have to do is ask.
